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Management and Administrative Aspects of Clinical Supervision

- Participants will be exposed to templates and ideas to enhance the clinical supervisor's ability to attend to the organizational processes procedures associated with the management and administrative aspects of clinical supervision

There will be an opportunity to discuss these concepts within the training group to enhance practical application and understanding. Participants will be provided with tip sheets and resources for easy reference.

Objectives:

- Participants will become aware of the inherent ethical and legal issues associated with clinical supervision
- Participants will explore and understand concepts related to competence, due process in evaluation, informed consent, types of supervisor liability, privileged communication, and consultation
- Participants will review the most updated regulatory issues including Ohio laws governing the practice of counseling and counseling supervision, professional standards and credentialing processes

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Ethics for the Prevention Professionals

In this training participants will discuss basic ethical theory and gain a sense of what drives personal and professional behavior. Participants will review and discuss the Ohio Chemical Dependency Professionals Board requirements and Code of Ethics for Prevention Professionals. We will look at a number of real life scenarios that prevention professionals may find themselves in and discuss in small groups what the appropriate action to take may be. This training will also discuss Social Media Ethics in today's culture and setting appropriate boundaries. Lastly, participants will discuss easy to follow guidelines for personal and professional decision making.

Objectives:

- Participants will gain an introduction to Ethics and basic theory
- Participants will increase their understanding of the Ohio Chemical Dependency Professionals Board requirements and Code of Ethics for prevention professionals
- Participants will discuss why ethical practice is crucial for prevention work and how it establishes trust for potential future encounters in the treatment and recovery processes
- Participants will develop guidelines for personal and professional decision making

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Integration of Mental Health and Gambling Prevention in the Scope of Practice for Prevention Professionals in Ohio



In 2015 the scope of prevention professionals through the Ohio Chemical Dependency Board was broadened to include behavioral health and gambling prevention. This training will explore the implication of this change, and how prevention professionals can prepare to further integrate behavioral health and gambling into their initiatives.

Objectives:

- Participants will explore the concurrent yet separate development of behavioral health, drugs and alcohol, and gambling prevention
- Participants will analyze similarities and differences between behavioral health, drugs and alcohol, and gambling problems and their implication in prevention practice
- Participants will explore instances in which integration is and is not appropriate to address these issues
- Participants will explore strategies to increase communication and networking between professionals within these different fields

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID



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Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is an eight-hour course that teaches you how to help someone who is developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health crisis. The training helps you identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. A three-year certification in MHFA is available upon completion of the 2-day course. You must attend both days to obtain the MHFA certification. Our nationally certified trainers teach a five-step action plan that will help you assess a situation, implement appropriate interventions, and help the person connect with professional care.

Objectives:

- Participants will become familiar with the signs and symptoms of depression, anxiety, substance use disorders, and mental illnesses with psychotic features
- Participants will learn how to respond to mental health crises such as panic attacks, suicide and acute psychosis
- Participants will learn how to intervene early during the development of a mental health problem to decrease the severity of the impact of the illness
